

Admission Rules

- (d) Children of transferable bodies / PSUs etc.
- (e) Children from any other category.

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Method of Admission

Parents desirous of admitting their children should collect the application form from the school office, from the 2nd week of December. Admission will however be granted as per priorities given in the admission rule. In case there is a large number of children left out, then the following criteria will be adopted in giving priority for admission.

- 1. Siblings in Little Kingdom
- 2. The Child residing near to Little Kingdom School
- 3. Single girl child.

Skill tests will be conducted for all children who wish to join the school. The subjects for admission test for various class is as follows:

- 1. Foundation Level (Playgroup, L.K.G II)
 - Playgroup and L.K.G ----> Interview
 - I and II ----> English, Mathematics, Tamil
- 2. Primary Level (III to V)
 - English, Mathematics, EVS, Tamil, Hindi
- 3. Middle Level (VI to VIII)
 - English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Tamil, Hindi
- 4. Senior Level (IX to XII)
 - IX, X -----> English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Tamil, Hindi
 - XI, XII ----> Xth Board exam marks.
- 5. Filled in forms should be submitted with all the required documents within a week's time. Admission will be confirmed only after a personal interaction and on the availability of seats in the particular grade.

Fee Rules

The fee shall be paid before the 10^{th} of every Term. The fee payment is divided into 2 terms March, September. The fee shall be collected before the 10^{th} of April and 10^{th} of October. A fine of Rs.100/- will be collected if the amount is not remitted on the prescribed date. Children who are found to default the fee payment will be struck off from the admission register. No fees will be refunded on any account and Parents shall not meet the Principal/Management in this regard.

Withdrawals

Parents who wish to withdraw their child from the school must inform the school administration at least three months in advance before submitting a formal request for the Transfer Certificate (TC). This advance notice helps ensure a smooth transition and completion of necessary formalities. Failure to provide the required notice may result in additional fees as per school regulations. For further assistance, parents are requested to contact the school office.

Curriculum of studies

Education in Little Kingdom School spans over a period of twelve +3 years from class Play school to XII. The examination and courses of study followed upto class XII are those prepared by the National Council of Education Research and Training and prescribed by the Central Board of Secondary Education. Class X & Class XII students are prepared for the Secondary School Exam & Senior Secondary Examination conducted by the Board, Due emphasis is laid on the curriculum on national identity and value education.

Tests, Examination & Promotions

Unit tests will be conducted regularly in each subject as many times as necessary with a minimum of 03 tests. For classes I to VIII the promotion will be based on their overall performance in all the tests held throughout the year. There will be 2 main exams in September and March

VI - IX, XI ANNUAL EXAMINATION - The student must obtain 35% marks in each of the academic subjects maintaining the aggregate of 35% in all the subjects(academic).

X, XII - CBSE, BOARD EXAMINATION

Attendance

Students having less than 75% attendance in an academic session will not be allowed to sit in the session ending examination. The Principal is authorized to condense shortage in attendance upto 15% in special circumstances like illness etc. A pupil who has not put in atleast 60% attendance shall be detained in the same class.

Attendance on the first day after vacation is compulsory



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TO THE STUDENTS

Punctuality and Regularity

Example - Joe had worked for 10 years with all his loyalty for his company. He was cut to the quick when his boss held him responsible for the theft.

56. Go bananas -

Example - Your decision to go abroad for a year will make your family go bananas.

57. Lump in your throat -

58. Hard as nails -

60. Proud as a peacock -

Example - His son is has finally become a doctor. He is as proud as a peacock.

61. Tongue-tied -

Meaning - Difficulty in expressing yourself because of nervousness or embarrassment.

Example - As her prospective in laws came to see her, she was completely tongue tied.

62. Look on the bright side -

Meaning - View an unpleasant situation in a positive light.

Example - You met with an accident but look on the bright side - you managed to get away just with some bruises.

63. Swallow one's pride -

Meaning - Accepting something humiliating or embarrassing.

Example - When his son was caught cheating in the exam. He had to swallow his pride and meet the principal.

64. Makes your flesh crawl -

Example - The sight of the accident made my flesh crawl.

65. Speak volumes -

Meaning - Expresses a reaction without words.

Example - She came to pick me at the station at an odd hour. Her actions spoke volumes about her bravity.

66. Not turn a hair -

Meaning - Refers to not exhibiting any emotion where it is expected.

Example - He didn't turn a hair even after his office was raided by the CBI.

67. Reduce to tears -

Meaning - Getting into tears because of some one's behaviour.

Example - Her best friend stopped talking to her. This reduced her to tears.

68. In the bag -

Meaning - Refers to a situation when you are sure that success is sure.

Example - The wickets of opponent team fell down very fast, visitor seemed to be in the bag at the end of 25 overs.

69. Blow up in face -

Meaning - Refers to a situation when a plan or project suddenly fails.

Example - It was difficult to get a place in the train to Mumbai. It blew up in the face when a train de-railed and blocked the track.

70. Bottom fell out -

Meaning - Refers to a situation when a plan or project fails.

Example - When the police announced a red alert in the city, the bottom fell out of their plan to hold a rally.

71. Cake not worth the candle -

73. Come up roses -

82. Live on the breadline -

Meaning - Having very little income.

Example - The partition of the country has left many people on the breadline.

83. Make or break -

Meaning - Circumstances causing total success or total ruin.

Example - The huge investment in this big project with make or break him.

84. Landslide victory -

Meaning - Overwhelming victory received by a candidate of political party at an election.

Example - With a win of more of than 40% seats in the first two hours of counting, they are expecting a landslide victory.

85. Let slip through fingers -

Meaning - Failing to obtain or keep up a good opportunity.

Example - This opportunity can be your break through in the industry. Don't let it slip through your fingers.

86. Rags to riches -

Meaning - Becoming very rich while starting very poor.

Example - His innovative ideas in business got him from rags to riches.

87. On the pig's back -

Meaning - Refers to a person in successful and well situation.
